It gives me immense pleasure to present the Annual Report of National Public School, Hosur Road 2021-2022. Academics has always been and will always remain in the forefront of the school's functioning and our hearts swell with pride as we declare that our students performed commendably this academic year despite the challenges year brought with it.

We started our academic year with the **Orientation Programmes**, conducted across grades:

For grades 1 and 2: conducted on **28th May 2021**

For grades 3, 4 and 5: conducted on **29th May 2021**

For grades 6,7,8: conducted on **29th May 2021**.

Our goal was to establish a meaningful relationship with the parents and familiarize them with the school rules, policies and activities. The Orientation program was chaired by the honourable Director-Principal Mrs Usha Mahesh Reddy and Vice-Principal-Sr. Academic Co-ordinator Mrs. Nirmala Mohan. School reopened for students on 2.6.21 on MS Teams. The classes were conducted online owing to Covid-19.

Students performed various yogasanas along with the yoga instructors exhibiting their strength, balance and flexibility.

Music Day was celebrated on 21st June 2021, with students showcasing their talents in singing and playing instruments. The special assembly for **Friendship Day** celebrated on 30th July, had our tiny tots narrate the epic story on friendship about Krishna and Sudama and sing and dance to tunes on friendship.

The **Independence Day** celebration on 15th August had children show their love for our country through patriotic songs and dances along with the address of the Principal. The special assembly to mark the annual harvest, **Onam**, was conducted on 19th August with students narrating the story behind celebration of Onam, with performances of the Onam song, dance and sharing Onam wishes in different languages.

The teachers were in for a pleasant surprise with a special assembly put up by the 8th graders for **Teachers' Day**. Inspiring students to follow the path of truth and non-violence, the assembly for celebration of Gandhi Jayanthi was held on 1st October. Celebrating the glory of the culture and heritage of Karnataka - **Karnataka Rajyotsava** assembly conducted on 29th October. We started the program by invoking god's blessings through a prayer dance set to a Kannada song; One of our students gave an inspiring speech about Integration of Karnataka. This celebration included various entertaining events such as fancy dress depicting the famous personalities of Karnataka, highlighting the 8 Jnana Peetha Awardees of Kannada Literature. The 'Library week' was conducted between 15th to 20th November with a variety of activities to promote reading and to encourage students to read. **Constitution Day** assembly, held on 26th November, to commemorate the adoption of Constitution of India created awareness about our preamble, role of Dr.B.R.Ambedkar in the framing of our constitution and also some interesting facts about our constitution.

The Christmas Day celebration on 24th December, had children singing carols and dancing to songs about Christmas. It left children in a festive mood, that carried to their class parties before going on their Christmas break.
