Gene Transfer: Bacteria can acquire resistance genes from different bacteria through horizontal gene transfer, which includes conjugation, transformation, or transduction.





Unraveling Cosmic History



By observing the infrared signatures of these ancient galaxies, JWST will provide crucial data about their formation and evolution, shedding light on the early stages of cosmic history. This pioneering research could offer profound insights into how the universe transitioned from a hot, dense state to one filled with stars and galaxies.

Probing Exoplanetary Atmospheres

Another groundbreaking aspect of JWST's mission is its capability to analyse the atmospheres of exoplanets—planets orbiting stars beyond our solar system. By observing the infrared light passing through these atmospheres as they transit their host stars, JWST will decipher their chemical compositions. This data is essential in determining the potential habitability of exoplanets and identifying signs of life beyond Earth.

Studying Stellar Nurseries

JWST's advanced infrared sensors will also peer into stellar nurseries—regions where stars are born from collapsing clouds of gas and dust. By capturing high-resolution images and spectra of these stellar nurseries, scientists hope to understand the processes that govern star formation and the role of environment in shaping the characteristics of newborn stars.

Components of a Conventional Rocket:


- 1) Propellant – The Fuel

The Curse of Tutankhamun

Are you afraid of the Curses?

It was while I was glancing through the pages of a newly bought encyclopaedia that a strange name struck my eyes. Tutankhamun. A tomb of a pharaoh, with a lot of priceless treasures and the mysterious stories of the curse around it. It aroused the curiosity of a history lover in me. I started reading more on Egypt and it's much talked about Tutankhamun's curse. I am sharing the story of Tutankhamun and his curse for you all here.

King Tutankhamun or King Tut was the last of the royal family during the end of the 18th dynasty in the New Kingdom in Egyptian history. He took the throne at the age of 9 when his father King

Akhenaten had died. King Tut had mysteriously died at the age of 18 the real reason for his death has not yet been clarified by archaeologists. His burial place was lost for many years.

King Tutankhamun's tomb was discovered in late 1922, by British Archaeologists Howard Carter and his financial backer Lord Carnarvon. They were searching under the sands of Egypt when they found the tomb. The burial chamber was surrounded by gold, jewellery, chariots, clothing and artefacts. These were, as Egyptians believed saved for the afterlife. After years of searching, they had found the tomb of the young king. Lord Carnarvon and Howard Carter immediately became celebrities.

A few days after the discovery of the tomb Lord Carnarvon was found dead with an infected mosquito bite which led to blood poisoning. He wasn't the only one who was dead. His half-brother also died from blood poisoning, Sir Archibald Douglas who had x- rayed the mummy died from a mysterious illness, Arthur Mace who was in Carter's excavation team died due to arsenic poisoning and followed by many other people who were part of the discovery of the tomb. This led many people to believe that this was all because of a curse that priests had put for tomb robbers during the mummification of the young king. Although researchers haven't found any curse, people still believe in it. • Navami Anand - 11A

Nalanda university, the first and largest university in the world was established in 427 CE and after 800 years of establishment was later burnt down by Bakhtiyar Khilji. It was the biggest library in the world and contained many manuscripts and when put to fire, burnt for 3 whole months. At present the university is present at Rajgir in Bihar, India. The Nalanda University Act was passed by Parliament in 2010, the real impetus for the construction of the project came under the direction of Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi with the construction of the present project beginning in 2017 with the help of 18 member countries of the East Asia Summit like Korea, Japan, Thailand, Vietnam, etc. On 19 June 2024, Wednesday India's prime minister Shri Narendra Modi inaugurated the Nalanda university which is a new beginning for India after the university began preserved and rebuilt.








Monthly Treat - Healthy and Junk Food



Independence day special assembly







INDEPENDENCE DAY


